1. Financial Assistance



CBDC General Business Loan

The CBDC General Business Loan is designed to assist entrepreneurs to obtain financing for this business, when traditional avenues of financing are not available.





CBDC First-Time Entrepreneur Loan

Tailored financing for new entrepreneurs of any age looking to start a new business or purchase an existing one.



CBDC Youth Loan

Tailored financing for young entrepreneurs ages 18-34 interested in starting, expanding or modernizing a business.

Kick\$tart Loan

Up to \$10,000 for a youth micro loan





CBDC Social Enterprise Loan

Tailored financing designed to assist social enterprises in rural based communities in Atlantic Canada.



CBDC Innovation Loan

Tailored to assist in the development of the knowledgebased economy in the adoption and commercialization of technology by rural businesses.





NEW - CBDC Newcomer Loan

Tailored financing up to \$20,000 for those that would not otherwise receive support because of their resident status.



2. Entrepreneur Development & Skills Training



Business Counselling

Business counselling in the form of advice and help to new and established entrepreneurs is a big part of our mandate.





Business Management Skills Training

Tailored training programs intended to help entrepreneurs improve their business management skills or build new ones. Training can be one-on-one or in group settings.



2. Technical Assistance &Other Support Programs

Self-Employment Assistance (SEA) Program

The SEA Program often provides a much needed catalyst for new entrepreneurs, helping them to realize their goal of becoming a business owner by providing them with financial and coaching support during the planning and start-up phases of their business.



Consulting Advisory Services (CAS)

Gives CBDCs the ability to offer consultant advisory services to small and medium-sized businesses and not-for-profit organizations throughout the Atlantic region.

New and existing clients of CBDCs will be able to access technical and financial assistance by engaging consultants to assist them with various issues.





Business Valuation

Gives CBDCs the ability to offer business valuation services to small and medium-sized businesses in Newfoundland

and Labrador.





A Regional Economic Development Pilot Project Proposal for the Exploits Valley

Project Overview:

- A Private-sector led Regional Economic Development (RED) initiative component modelled after the Cape Breton Partnership.
- This pilot project will propose and demonstrate a model for Regional Economic Development in the central region of the province, based on leading research and practice in regional planning across the Global North.
- Community Business Development Corporation (CBDC) Central will be the delivery agent for the regional project.

Objectives and Outcomes

This project will partner with businesses, municipalities, and residents on a regional economic development initiative to provide planning and coordination of the following outcomes:

- A strategic economic plan (SEP) will be prepared by the team at CBDC, with consultation from al stakeholders throughout the region.
- The SEP will guide future investment into the region to include, but not be limited to, the following sectors:
 - Supplier Diversification
 - Labour Market Development
 - Tourism Development
 - Climate Adaptation/Green infrastructure and Energy Development
- Increase opportunity for new business and business retention and expansion (BR&E)
- Increase capacity for municipalities to complete work in regional planning
- Stabilize the population decline and negative trending demographics, with hopes of seeing a modest reverse in the declining trend within 5 years.
- Develop sustainable economic opportunities to maintain meaningful employment for residents of the whole area.

Reporting Structure and Governance:

- Contract agreements for this pilot project will be between partners and CBDC Central.
- The project will create an additional position at CBDC Central of Economic Development Officer or comparable title.
- The position will report to the Executive Director of CBDC Central and fall under the governance of the CBDC Board of Directors.
- An Advisory Committee of Official Partners, including the Exploits Chamber of Commerce, will be established for the reporting purposes of this project.

Proposed dates of Project:

- · The proposed project is for 3 years.
- Desired start date of January 2024.
- Project to end December 31, 2026, subject to renewal.
